Staffing

The class topics are now underway. The infant and pre-school topic is Around the World with Barnaby Bear. Class 2 is working on Ancient Greece whilst Class 3 will be studying World War 1. These are the topic themes and give a framework for the term but all other curricular areas are planned into our provision. More on this below. One additional exciting project to mention is the Tim Peake Primary Space Project. We have been really lucky to have been selected for this work where we learn using space and space exploration to explore science and many other subjects. There is even a chance that we may get to meet Tim Peake himself!

We will have opportunities for you to come in to school, where the children can share their learning with you and we will hold the annual book fair soon. The main one of these will be a larger scale Carol Concert and PTA Christmas Fayre to complete the term.

CLASS 1

The Infant Team would like to wish you a very warm welcome back after the summer holidays and we hope you'll join us in extending that welcome to the new families that have joined us this year.



We are two weeks into the term already and your children have all settled beautifully. We are very excited about all of the fun new things we have to learn and share with your children this year at school.

Our topic this term is

'Around the world with Barnaby Bear.'

We will start by getting to know each other and talking about what we did in the holiday and then start our topic about Barnaby Bear. Our focus in Geography this half term will be learning about places in Great Britain. In Science we will be learning about how things move, by pushing or pulling. Our History focus will be learning about Guy Fawkes, London and the Great Fire of London.

In our daily Maths, Literacy and Phonics sessions we will follow the Primary National Curriculum and the EYFS curriculum.

Helping your child at home: If you want to help your child with their learning at home, you can do this in your everyday activities by noticing and talking about sounds, words, numbers, shapes, colours and time as you go about your daily routines with your children. When out and about, it would help to talk about names of trees, plants and animals and to notice the changes in the seasons, to tie in with our ongoing learning in Science. To help with reading, one of the best things you can do is share a love of stories with your child. Learning to read is hard work and it helps to focus on the enjoyment and fun that we all get from reading! Obviously the older children in our class need to be reading a little bit every day if possible, there is always a clear difference in the progress made by those children who read regularly at home and those who don't! We will continue to change school reading books on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays for year ones. Reception children will begin to bring home story books for you to enjoy together, feel free to change these in the mornings with your child as you finish them.

PE kits are to be kept on your child's peg during the week. They need to have PE kits in school every day. Currently sessions are on Thursdays with Chris from Pro Coaching.

Leap into Life: Pre-school children will also continue to come to the school once a week to take part in our 'Leap in to Life' sessions with the Reception children, as part of our PE programme, helping to develop gross motor skills, an essential precursor to developing fine motor skills and writing!

Coats: Please bring to school every day! The weather can change so quickly and children will need them for all playtimes and other outdoor activities as we like to get outside as much as possible!

Snacks, water, milk and free fruit: Your child is welcome to bring their own healthy snack for morning play if you prefer but free fruit is available to all children in our class. Water is always available in class, cups are kept by the sink. Milk cartons have to be ordered, and you should have all received a form for this. Milk is free for under 5s and a small cost for others, if your child would like milk please ask in the office.

End of school: At the end of the school day, we send one child out of the gate at a time, only when we spot the person collecting them! As you can appreciate we have a big class and we need to ensure they are all collected safely. If you can keep an eye out for your child in the line and wave at us, it helps us to spot you quicker! Mr Scandrett and other cover teachers will follow this routine as well. Miss Alderman does bus and taxi duty each day.

CLASS 1

First Aid: We record accidents in the school accident book. If the accident is more severe or a concern, or perhaps your child is unwell, we will phone you directly. If a child bumps their head, they are assessed and usually require a cold compress, a red letter will be sent home with details.

Labels: Please ensure all items of clothing are named and labelled as changing for PE can get very muddled!

Staff: Mrs Hancock teaches the class, with planning, preparation and assessment time on Wednesday mornings and Thursday afternoons. Outdoor Learning will take place on Thursday afternoons with Mr Scandrett. Please ensure children have wellies and waterproof coats and trousers for these sessions.

Teaching Assistants: Miss Gale and Miss Paula Alderman are full time. If you have any questions or concerns please don't hesitate to get in touch with me or one of the other members of the Infant Team. After school is easier to discuss individual questions; mornings can be busy, but please inform us of any information such as changes to collection arrangements, etc, which will be noted on the class board. CLASS 2

Dear Parents,

Welcome to all parents who are new to Class 2 and welcome back to those of you who were with us previously. I hope you all had a great summer. Well done to all the children for settling in and getting down to work so quickly, I have been really impressed by everyone.

Topic



This term our topic is Ancient Greece. We have already begun learning about this fascinating subject and the children have started making some pottery. Over the course of the term we will learn about the way of life during this time and discover the amazing things people achieved. As well as completing written work on the subject the children will take part in a wide range of practical and craft activities

to really make the topic come to life.

Staff

Mrs Cockram and Miss Davie will be in Class 2 as teaching assistants this year. On a Wednesday afternoon, Mr Scandrett will take the class for Outdoor Learning and on a Thursday cover will be provided by Mrs Bondy.

PE and Outdoor Learning

This year, PE lessons will take place on a Thursday; please ensure your child has their PE kit in school each week. As the weather gets colder, and wetter, trousers, jumpers and spare socks may well be needed. Please could you also ensure that all PE kit is named.

Outdoor Learning will take place throughout the winter therefore appropriate clothing, particularly footwear, will be needed.

Homework

All children should bring home a reading book each day. Although we do hear children read within school, it will really help if someone at home could listen to your child read as often as possible. Please make a quick note in their reading record if you do hear them read. If your child is a proficient

reader, asking them questions about the text they have read is the next step forward.

Each week, the class will be given one piece of written homework. This could either be maths or literacy based. Homework will be given to the class on a Friday for them to complete and hand in by Tuesday. On top of this, they may also be given some times tables or spellings on occasion.

Other information

We aim to take the children out for break times as much as possible, even if it is raining so children need to have a named coat in school every day.

If children wish to keep a drinks bottle in the class to use throughout the day, I would prefer this bottle to contain only water with squash being reserved for lunch times. This is partly to prevent sticky spills but also to help with the health of your child's teeth.

CLASS 3

Dear Parents,

Welcome back everyone. I hope you all had a wonderful summer holiday and are glad to be back at school. We have been very lucky in Class 3 to have some building work done over the summer holiday. We now have brand new windows, a full re-paint of the classroom and some new furniture. The children are thrilled with the 'new look' classroom and you are all welcome to come and have a look.

It is great to see all the year 5 and 6 children so ready and raring to go. We had a great start back this week and we are all looking forward to the year ahead with numerous projects and interesting topics being taught.



There have been a few changes in staff too. The team in Class 3 now consists of myself, Mr Scandrett and Mrs Bondy. I will be teaching all the core subjects during the morning sessions; Literacy, Numeracy, Science and also ICT. Mrs Bondy will be delivering the Foundation subjects during the afternoons on Monday, Thursday and Friday.

Topic

Our topic this term is World

War One, also known as the First World War, or the Great War, which was a global war originating in Europe that lasted from 28



July 1914 to 11 November 1918. More than 70 million military personnel, including 60 million Europeans, were mobilised in one of the largest wars in history.

PE

My class will now have PE with Pro-coaching each **Thursday** afternoon so please ensure that your child has their PE kit in school on this day. I also advise that as the weather is very changeable (and quite cold on some days) could you send your child to school with

jogging bottoms and a jumper. This is because we still teach outside, whatever the weather!

Outdoor Learning

Mr Scandrett delivers outdoor learning on a **Tuesday** and alternates this with some PE sessions. Please make sure your child has both their PE kit and also their outdoor learning clothes for this afternoon.

Homework

All children are given a piece of Numeracy and Literacy homework

each **Friday**. This is to be completed and handed in by the following **Thursday**. We also have a six minute club tables test each Friday. All the children are now on different tables depending on progress. These mini tests are available for the children to take to practice at home under their own volition.

We have guided reading groups each morning, where children are required to read their set pages at home, and I also encourage all children to read with an adult at least twice a week. If you do listen to your

child read (anything which interests them) then please can you make a note of it in their reading records so I can see how much they are reading and also what they are interested in?

If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to come and speak to me after school or make an appointment through the office for more urgent matters and I will contact you as soon as possible.
